# STA Level 2 Certificate for the National Rescue Standard - Poolside Helper

The STA Poolside Helper qualification aims to train poolside helpers and swimming teachers in pool rescue skills, CPR techniques, first aid and to be competent to deal with poolside emergencies.



## Pre-requisites

- Be of 14 years of age
- © Complete the Aquatic Rescue Foundation unit of the Level 2 Certificate for the National Rescue Standard
- © Complete the The Pool Attendant unit of the Level 2 Certificate for the National Rescue Standard.
- Be capable of swimming 25 metres (candidates who cannot swim 25 metres must be capable of wading, and effecting a rescue, in a pool with a depth no greater than chest height).

Validity of Award 2 years.

### Course Information

The STA Poolside Helper qualification covers:

- Demonstrating various simulated rescue scenarios safely and effectively whilst wearing minimal additional clothing
- 5 Demonstrating resuscitation on a live simulated casualty
- Demonstrating neutral alignment and the jaw thrust manoeuvre for a casualty with a suspected
- spinal injury on a manikin
- Demonstrating CPR for 3 minutes on either a drowning casualty or a cardiac arrested casualty
- 5 Demonstrating CPR for 3 minutes on either a baby or child manikin.

- © Complete a portfolio and worksheet questions to the satisfaction of the course tutor
- © Complete 4, 10 question multiple-choice papers with pass marks of 7/10.

This qualification requires revalidation every 2 years to update knowledge and demonstrate understanding
